Robins and wrens - Year 2

WOW, we certainly have learnt lots about people who have made significant changes in history.

To kick start our new topic 'One small step', the children arrived at school to be greeted with the night sky and instructions to head straight into Robins class. The classroom was filled with dazzling laser light stars and we watched the footage of Neil Armstrong taking his first steps on the moon. The children were fascinated with the old fashioned footage and we enjoyed talking about the Apollo 11 space mission. We then became space engineers and designed our very own moon landing module for a very precious egg-spaceman. It was the moment of truth, Wrens and Robins presented their moon landing modules to the rest of the class. As a year group we investigated which modules were the strongest and why. We dropped them from a height and watched them fall. We then opened them up to see if our spacemen had survived the journey. We are pleased to report that many of them did!

Throughout the rest of the topic, we have worked really hard to find out lots about Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus and their significance throughout history. We researched



many facts using a range of media and made our very own fact files! We also used papier Mache to create the surface of the moon, being careful to make craters. We found out that the Earth orbits the sun, and the moon moves around the Earth and created models to show this. To celebrate the end of our topic, we were lucky enough to have our Coffee and Croissant class assemblies where we were able to share all that we had learnt this term. Year 2 have certainly had a busy half term filled with fantastic learning.

ANGRY EARTH Squirrels and Rabbits - Year 3



What a brilliant start to the spring term, we kick started our 'Angry Earth' topic by reading the Magic School bus adventure to the centre of the Earth. Following on from this, we completed a problem solving activity where we had to decide which 10 items we would take with us if we visited one of the world's famous volcanoes. We have learnt about the layers, which make up the Earth and have used atlas' to investigate tectonic plates and how these



create volcanoes and earthquakes, we loved finding out all about the Ring of Fire! In science, we began our 'Rock and Fossil' learning by investigating types of rocks. We learnt that rocks are located in our local environment in many different ways, from jewellery, tiles and even the windows! We explored the terms 'Igneous, Metamorphic and Sedimentary' and looked at a variety of rocks, identifying and grouping each one based on their properties.



In computing this half term, we have created algorithms and explored the importance of giving clear and precise instructions to guide a character to a set destination. After lots of practise, organising each instruction in the right order we were able to make an exciting animation.

ELECTRIC BIKE VISIT Badgers and Foxes - Year 4



This half term, Year 4 were fortunate enough to have a visit from Sustrans, to help us with our science topic which was all about electricity. During our session, we learnt about what has to happen for electricity to be made and how this happens in the real world.

It helped us to understand where we get our electricity from and also the really important facts about renewable and non-renewable energy. The best part of the morning was definitely when we got to have a go on a specially designed bike that generated electricity when you pedalled it! We were able to see how much hard work goes into powering just one lightbulb! The children really enjoyed their visit and some of us even managed to peddle hard enough to power 4 different electric appliances!

Year 3 and 4 Gymnastics event:

The children had a fantastic time learning a range of skills throughout the gymnastics event. They began the morning with a fun filled warm up; playing a game, which required them to pose in different balances. They continued the event by developing their skills of forward rolls, handstands and cartwheels. The event was concluded with use of the apparatus, they used a beam to pull themselves along to a horse and jumped off in a variety of different ways.
